

Fact sheet Meeting the APST at the Graduate Teacher level

Supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learners

The <u>Australian Professional Standards for Teachers</u> (APST) are used by all registered teachers in Australia and underpin the requirements for the accreditation of <u>initial</u> teacher education (ITE) programs.

The APST are designed to clarify the knowledge, practice and professional engagement required for all teachers and provide a common language for teachers, teacher educators, organisations, professional associations, and the general public.

APST at the Graduate Teacher level

All ITE programs must ensure that pre-service teachers (PSTs) meet the Graduate Teacher level of the APST, which is a theoretical knowledge and understanding of the Standards.

It's important that ITE providers support PSTs in meeting Standards 1.4 and 2.4, and promote understanding and respect, to provide the best possible education opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learners.



This Standard requires PSTs to 'demonstrate broad knowledge and understanding of the impact of culture, cultural identity and linguistic background on the education of students from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander backgrounds' at the graduate teacher level.



APST 2.4 - Understand and respect Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to promote reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians

This Standard requires PSTs to 'demonstrate broad knowledge of, understanding of and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and languages' at the graduate teacher level.
