## HOW TO MOVE TO FULL REGISTRATION: INTRO - HOW TO BECOME FULLY REGISTERED

*If you're a provisionally registered teacher wanting to progress to full registration, there are two things you need to do:*

- 1. Complete at least 80 days of teaching*
- 2. Be recommended for full registration by a recommendation panel.*

*In a series of videos, we're going to look at number two - What you need to present to the panel so that they will recommend you for full registration. We'll break it down into various steps so that you have everything you need to present to the panel.*

*You need to show the panel two things:*

- 1. that you have completed an "evidence-based" process with your learners, using the Inquiry approach and*
- 2. that you have met all the descriptors of the APST – the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers – at the Proficient level.*

*This evidence-based process is like taking a snapshot of your teaching. Focus on some part of your teaching, perhaps a problem you want to solve with a particular group of your learners.*

*Follow the steps of the inquiry approach as you go about addressing this issue.*

*That includes working throughout the process with a mentor, and evaluating your practice.*

*Collect evidence as you go.*

*As part of the evidence you present to the panel, you'll show them the APST descriptors that you've addressed during your evidence-based process. You might have covered them all. If you haven't, you can show evidence from other parts of your teaching.*

*This evidence-based process is not something you do separate to your day-to-day teaching. It should be an integral part of it. It can help you solve a problem, improve your teaching and help you move to full registration.*
