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## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND RATIONALE

The Bachelor of Education (Honours) in Secondary Health and Physical Education is a 4.25 year undergraduate initial teacher education degree that prepares teachers for secondary school settings, predominately in Australia. Teacher candidates complete discipline studies in secondary teaching areas as well as discipline specific curriculum and pedagogical studies, general education studies and professional experience.

\*The approval will apply until **23/10/2024** subject to the following conditions.

1. If Monash University intend to make significant changes to the approved program, those changes must first be submitted to VIT for approval.
2. VIT may require the program to be amended so that it continues to satisfy the legislative imperative that it is a qualification appropriate for entry to teaching as approved from time to time by the Minister.
3. VIT will require information from Monash University to verify that the program complies with the requirements of a qualification appropriate for entry to teaching, including compliance with the Victorian framework for selection into initial teacher education.
