YOUR VIT REGISTRATION

Congratulations! You're now a registered member of the teaching profession in Victoria.

This is a short video to explain who we are at VIT and how you'll interact with us over your journey as a teacher.

So what's VIT?

VIT is the regulator of the teaching profession in Victoria. Our job is to assure parents and the general public that teachers in Victoria are qualified, suitable to be a teacher and maintain the standards and ethics required of the profession.

Your registration with VIT is effectively your ticket to teach.

There are three main ways in which VIT will play a role in your career in the profession:

- 1. When you maintain standards of professional practice, conduct and ethics*
- 2. When you move to full registration*
- 3. When you maintain your registration*

The Australian Professional Standards for Teachers tell you what you need to know, how to put it into practice, and how you should engage as a teacher. You can find the standards on our website, as well as the Victorian Teaching Profession Codes of Conduct and Ethics.

These will guide your career as a teacher. Make sure you're familiar with both.

Once you have taught for at least 80 days, you are eligible to move to full registration. You do this by providing evidence, using the inquiry approach, that you meet the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers at the Proficient teacher level.

There are a series of videos on how to move to full registration on our website.

Once you've become fully registered, you'll need to meet your annual professional practice requirements. You can find out more about that later.

For now, remember this date: September 30. September 30 is the due date for payment of your annual fee, which is part of maintaining your registration.

So that's how you'll interact with us at VIT throughout your career in the profession.

We'll do everything we can to make it easy for you to maintain your ticket to teach, and the rest is up to you.
